Rowing the Atlantic

A talk by James Kyall

In 2011 James Kayll led a crew in a record rowing attempt across the Indian Ocean. They completed the 3,500 mile journey in 75 days. In 2013 James returned to the oars, this time to lead a team of military amputees in a rowing race across the Atlantic. Five crew were recruited and despite missing three legs and a hand, against the elements and after surviving a catastrophic capsizing, the soldiers completed the 3,000 miles in a respectable 48 days, finishing third.

Through photo and film James will share his story from the Atlantic talking about some of the pains and pleasures of ocean rowing.
